GED Scores

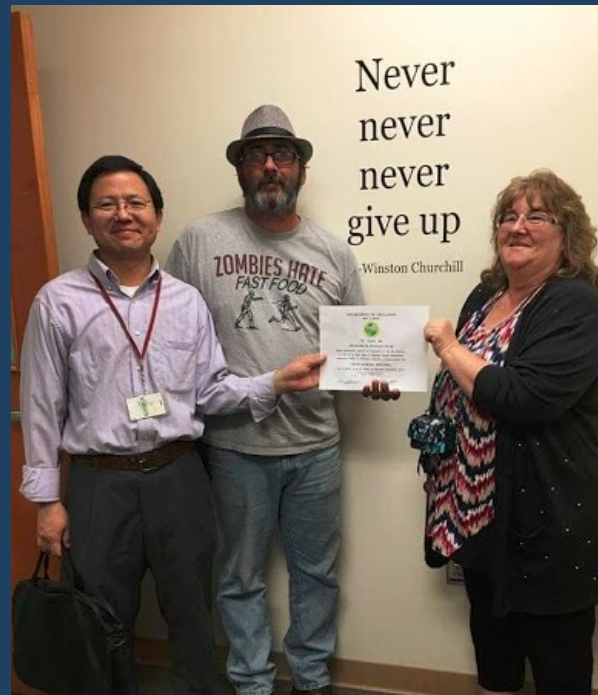
GED has lowered the cut score required to pass the high school equivalency exam from 150 to 145. The new scores will be retroactive to January 2016.
